## Head's Message

It has been a great week at Ludgvan School. The children have been working very hard and continuing to become accustomed to routines in their new classrooms. They have clearly been thinking hard about the conversations we had in assembly last week about resilience and this is showing in their application to their work! This week we had 2 assemblies with KS2 (Years 3, 4, 5 & 6) and KS1/EYFS (Years 1, 2 & EYFS) being separate. In KS2 we discussed International Day of Democracy and considered how this value is demonstrated in school. We value everyone's voice, pupils surveys and pupil parliament allow us a say, our school and classroom rules create equity by making sure all are respected and heard. We also revisited resilience, and watched a video of Derek Redmond finishing his race at the 1992 Olympics despite his injury and disappointment, it's the effort that makes the difference and we should focus on this as much as the outcome. In KS1 & EYFS we looked at our school value 'Evolution' and how asking for and allowing ourselves to be helped is essential for us to learn. To help us discuss this we read the book, 'The Storm Whale,' by Benji Davis. We decided that it can be hard to ask for help if you think you might have made a mistake, but this is the best way to put things right, we also discussed how we can all be on the look out for others who may need our help without them having to ask. Accepting help allows us to be more resilient and take on more difficult challenges. While visiting classes this week I have been impressed by the perseverance and pride the children have been showing in their work. Well done everyone!
